23 teams from 13 schools competed in the [NH Envirothon](#).

Goffstown HS showed very strong skills, taking 1st overall (team 7) as well as winning first in the Current Environmental Issue. The Goffstown coaches are Larry Houghton and Michael Veilleux.

Students worked hard throughout the year to compete in the 2025 NH Envirothon Competition which took place at the Squam Lakes Natural Science Center in Holderness on 5/19. The 2025 Theme was Roots and Resiliency: Fostering Forest Stewardship in a Canopy of Change.

65 volunteers (mostly natural resource professionals) helped make this event run smoothly as well as inspiring students to pursue new careers in these fields.
